ye'd answer,

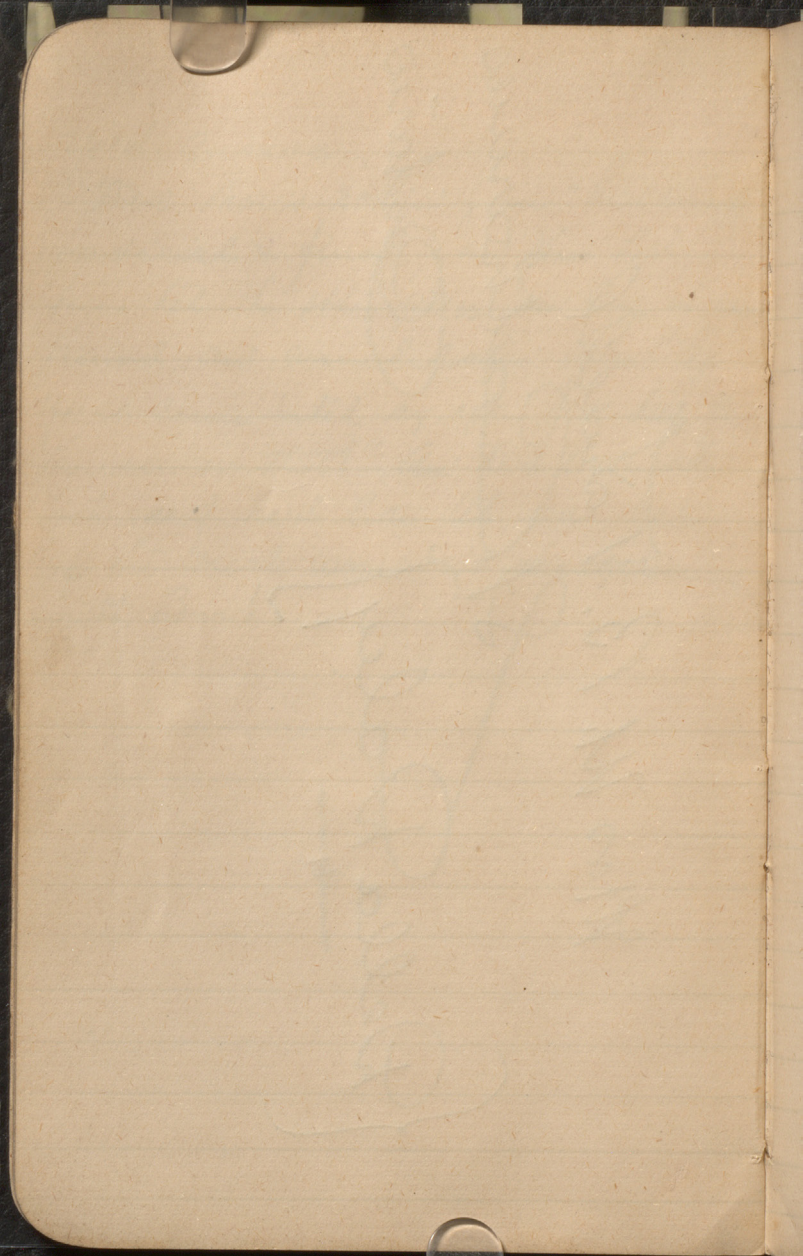
