# THE SCHOOL FOR CRIPPLED CHILDREN

45 CEDAR AVENUE, MONTREAL

---

A Thing of Beauty is a Joy Forever! Its loveliness increases.

Assuredly the School for Crippled Children can sound the note of joy for the year 1919 and thus far through the year 1920. Every child in the School, with his or her crippled, deformed body, is a "thing of beauty" because of the joyful happiness which wells in each young heart and which beams from each shining countenance.

In this School the boys and girls seem to forget that they are crippled, and they work with a vim and pleasure which shows that they love their lessons and their surroundings and that they mean to become independent and useful citizens. They evince a pride, too, which is a pleasing indication that they wish to do for others, in the future, what is now being done for them—that they will in turn help some helpless one, because they too are being helped. The older ones appear to take on trust, as it were, the advantages which they are now receiving, an account of which they feel must be rendered by them to a Higher Power.

Since the opening of the School, four years ago last April, two hundred and twenty-six pupils have been registered, many of whom have, in the interval of time, become physically able to return to their former schools. The pupils are encouraged to remain in the School for Crippled Children until their crippled conditions are fully cured, or sufficiently so to make it feasible for them to return to the public schools. Therefore, many of our former pupils are to be found in different schools in Montreal and the surrounding districts, taking their class standing with credit. The majority of our pupils must, however, remain for a longer time, during which period they may finish the public school curriculum and branch into commercial subjects, which include bookkeeping and multigraph work, shorthand and typewriting. They may also take High School subjects.

During the school term from September, 1919, to June, 1920, one hundred and four children were registered. A large percentage of these boys and girls were promoted to higher grades at the end of the school year and a few secured positions with business firms down town. Our present school enrollment is twelve times larger than the day on which the School opened, April 15th, 1916. Since then to the present moment, it has been a time of interesting work, keen enjoyment, and steady advancement in lessons and physical improvement.

The School has now three large motor ambulances, which are used to bring the children to the School each morning and to return them to their homes each afternoon. The newest and largest of these ambulances is a gift from the Kiwanis Club, of Montreal. It is proving a great boon, and facilitates to a nicety the transportation of the cripples to and from the School. It is known as the "Kiwanian," and every member of the School feels justly proud of it and deeply grateful for the gift.

Each day the children are served at the School with a wholesome, hot dinner; the mid-day menu being an important item on the School's time-table. The young cripples are fed, not only with a view to the satisfying of the keen appetites of growing boys and girls, but also with a view to their physical and mental improvement. Much thought is necessarily given to the choice and purchase of the food and to the preparing and the cooking of that food in order to keep within the lines of strict economy, and at the same time secure what is the best for the children to eat. Dinner hour is a happy and sociable time. Each meal is begun and ended with a song of praise to the Divine and interspersed throughout with lively songs and hearty cheers. The sanitary paper napkins and sanitary paper table covers and towels not only save a heavy laundry bill, but also teach the children the beauty of fresh table appointments each day, and it is a joy to see how anxious even the smallest child is to sip the soup from the side of the spoon, and break his bread into tiny morsels.

During the War, when the most rigid economy was practised by everyone, our cripples learned to make paper wood to supplement the firewood used in cooking the school dinners. The work of making this paper wood is still continued. Every scrap of paper and bit of garbage is used in preparing it. Nothing is thrown away but the ashes from the furnace and stove. The school's firewood, to a great extent, is composed of the dry branches and pieces of wood which the children pick up from under the trees in their mountain playground. The wood is gathered during recess and neatly piled, ready to be used in the kitchen stove. The price of coal is so high that we would not dare to use one lump of it for cooking. The coal must be used only for the heating of the School.

Wheatleigh, Mrs. Helen Bruun, Mr. G. H. Fensom, and to all the conveners, captains and official workers connected with the School's annual tag day; to the Pro Patria Society of the Girls' High School, Montreal, Miss Cunningham's class of the Commercial and Technical High School, The Christ Church Cathedral Choir, Miss Ball's Private School, The Trafalgar Institute, Miss Edgar's Private Academy, Miss Stone's Private School, the Lower Canada College, the theatres and moving pictures, Mr. Scheffer's dancing class, Mr. S. Levinson, Westmount High School, Mrs. Morrison and members of the East End Y.W.C.T.U., the Canadian Concert Direction Co., The Dufferin School Graduates' Society, Miss Phoebe Campbell, Mr. F. F. Loundes, The Chateauguay Boating Club, for many kind favours; to Mrs. Douglas Ogilvie and Mrs. Cohen for theatrical delights given to the young cripples; to the Kiwanians for a multiplicity of favours; to all the Curlers on

The School is growing daily, the cause is a worthy one and great, and we need the help of all.

Do visit our School! It is somewhat rare to find joyful happiness connected with affliction, but certainly our young cripples, though their conditions are in many cases very serious, seem to have found the true source of happiness. To one and all we offer a hearty invitation to come at any hour between 9 o'clock a.m. and 3 o'clock p.m. If you are sorrowful you will be made glad—if you are happy you will be made still happier—when you meet and know our boys and girls.

See Elevator in the School for Crippled Children, which Elevator the School has appreciatively termed "The Stewart." The good which has accrued from the installation of the Elevator it would be difficult to compute.

The youngest child in the School can operate it, for there is absolutely no danger of an accident occurring. "The Stewart," which cost over \$6000.00, is kept in constant repair under the terms of a yearly contract, the payment of which is also assumed by Mr. and Mrs. Stewart.

### A Garage Needed! Who will be the giver? Will You?

Are there those at this Christmas season who will emulate the kind donors of the Elevator, and build a garage for the use of the ambulances which carry upwards of one hundred helpless young cripples to and from the School each day?

The School is increasing rapidly, consequently the expenses are increasing. The School chauffeurs are practical mechanics, and could do all the repairs on the ambulances if there were a garage in connection with the School; thus the ambulance expenses would be lessened very materially.

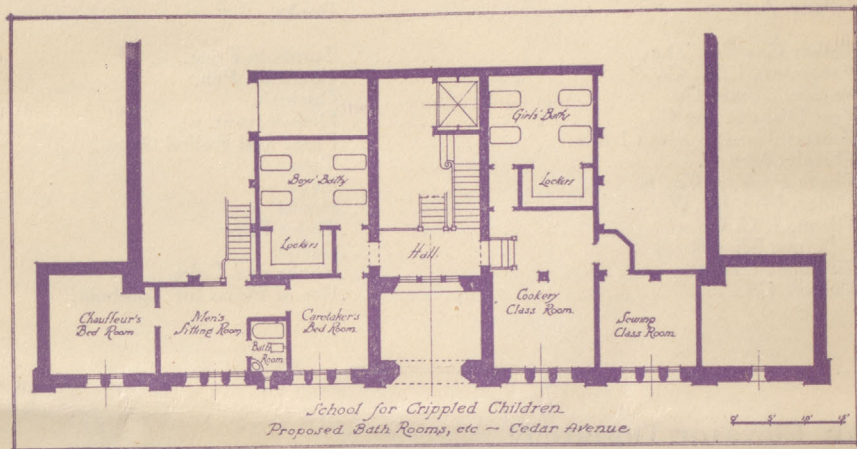
\$7000.00 is the estimate for such a garage. It is imperative that some friend or friends become interested in this project, if the highest results are to be attained for our young cripples.

## THE SUMMER CAMP OF THE SCHOOL FOR CRIPPLED CHILDREN

On the old Tyndale homestead, the entire use of which is donated to the cripples each summer.

At this camp over sixty young cripples, varying in age from five to sixteen years, play and eat and sleep for ten happy weeks in the summer and return to their homes and to their School having gained five, six, eight, ten and, in two instances, fourteen and fifteen pounds in weight.

Upwards of twenty Kiwanians motored sixty-two of the young cripples and those in charge of them to the Summer Camp on June 25th, 1920, and the same kind friends motored the merry company back to Montreal on September 1st.

The camp life is one of the happiest branches of the work among the cripples. But it calls for numerous necessities, and each year the number who attend the Summer Camp increases.

Will you help with either money, clothing, bedding, provisions or anything which would help to make the young cripples' camp life still more successful during the coming summer than in the past?
