There was formerly only one Circuit in the year; but by the act abolishing Heretable Jurisdctions in 1748, two Circuits were appointed to be held, one in spring and one in autumn, for the north, south, and west districts. The times are in the appointment of the Judges. If the Lord Justice General goes, he has 200 l. for each Circuit. The Justice-Clerk and Commissioners, when two of them go together, have for every south or west Circuit, 150 l. each, and for the north Circuit, 180 l. each. When one of them goes alone to the south or west Circuit, he has 250 l. and if the north Circuit, 300 l. There are three Deputy Advocates, one for each Circuit, commissioned by the King's Advocate, at 50 l. each.
