The yolk of a new laid egg,
beat up with three large Spoonful
of rose water, mix them well in
half a pint of new milk, sweeten
it with syrup of Capillaire, grate
into it a little Nutmeg, and take
this every morning fasting, for a
month. - Leave it off for a short
time, and if it has been of use,
take it another month. -

For Inflammation on the Chest
or Wind-pipe.

Take six, or eight Laurel leaves,
boil them a quarter of an hour in a
^{quart p.} water, and then exhale the vapour
through a funnel placed over a
Jar.

For a Jomentation, for an infla-
mation of the Lungs, mix Laurel
leaves may be added to the same
quantity of water.

If the complaint continues after this, take
 $\frac{1}{4}$ of an oz of prepared chalk, 30 drops of laudanum,
2 table spoonful of brandy, 8 oz of water, take
two table spoonful every 3 hours.

In a liver complaint

2 oz of dandelion roots freshly dug up, &
well washed, but not scraped & 2 oz of liquorice
roots, boiled together in a pint of water till it
simmers down to a pint, begin with a wine glassful
a day, & get on to 2. It ought to be persevered in for
months, as it is only an alterative.
