



The late SIR GEORGE A. DRUMMOND, K.C.M.G.

Charle

It may be of interest to those who become the possessors of pictures in the present sale to know something of the personality of Sir George A. Drummond who collected them.

He was born and educated in Edinburgh, and when a young man went out to Canada and became one of a band of Scotsmen who were pioneers in the development of that great country.

He settled in Montreal, became identified with the Canada Sugar Refinery, and was soon the controlling head of that successful industry. Possessed of great energy, business acumen and sagacity, he was foremost in initiating new enterprises of many kinds, and was Chairman of Coal, Jute and other Companies, President of the Montreal Board of Trade, Vice-President and (in succession to Lord Strathcona) President of the Bank of Montreal, the leading Bank in Canada. He was also chosen a Life Senator in the Canadian Senate.

Life in Canada in those days was very strenuous, and the task of developing a young country and overcoming the forces of nature was immense; yet with all this, Sir George found time for the cultivation of the supremer qualities of the mind. He had a fine taste in literature and music, and a great natural love for art generally, and notably for pictures. He gradually accumulated a choice collection of Works of Art, and was almost the pioneer in Canada in that respect. His example was followed by many others in Montreal, who have since become well known as collectors, until that city has now a Continental reputation.

Sir George's life was too busy to afford him much time for the detached Study of Art, but he had an almost intuitive perception of a really fine picture, and it followed that he took great pleasure in his
