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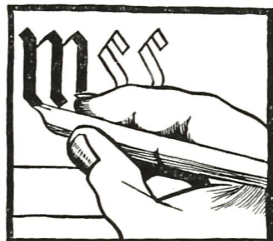

## F O R E W O R D

This is a list of the manuscripts in the McGill University Library, exclusive of the mediaeval and oriental manuscripts and of the Autograph Letters collection. It is meant as a finding list only, and omits historical annotation and bibliographical details, and it occasionally ignores accepted cataloguing rules in favour of simplicity.

The alphabetical order has been chosen, since these manuscripts have no archival quality and no arrangement of any kind; and the separation of Historical from Miscellaneous is made simply because the former category is by far the less unimportant.

Names have been written as they appear in the document ('Quebec' for example without its accent, since it is nearly always so written); and those names whose identification would have taken more time than was available have been left as found. The lists of addenda were unavoidable, as MSS turned up from time to time on the open shelves among the printed books.

The words 'Folio' and 'Quarto' have sometimes been used, quite incorrectly, of course, to indicate approximate size.

Compiling this list in brief intervals in the distractions of administration and without any competence as a Canadian historian, I am certain that there will be many errors obvious to the professional scholar: but as he will be aware of them, the harm done will not, I hope, equal the help given.
