*An Account of y^e Boats of y^e Continent of North America
as they are Regulated by y^e Postmasters Genl of y^e Post-Office
The Western Post sets out from Philadelphia every
Friday leaving Letters at Burlington and Perth Amboy
and arrives at New York on Sunday night; y^e distance
between Philadelphia and New York being 106 Miles
The Post goes out Saturday evening from New York
from New York, and arrives at New York on Sunday
morning; being 150 Miles, where the Post from Boston
sets out at the same time, the New York Post
returning with the Eastern Letters, and y^e Boston
Post with the Western, both are drop'd at New
London, Connecticut, at Rhode Island, the New York
Post from Boston to Piscataway being 70 Miles
leaving Letters at Ipswich, Salem, Marblehead
and Newbury. There are Offices kept at Burlington, Perth Amboy
in New Jersey, New London and Stonington in
Connecticut, at Rhode Island, the New York Post
at Salem, Marblehead and Newbury, and y^e Great
Office are at Boston, New York & Philadelphia.*

*The French by the Treaty of Utrecht are allowed to
catch Fish, and to dry them on Land, in that Part only
and no other, of the Island of Newfoundland, which
stretches from Cape Bonavista to the Northern Point
of the Island, and from thence running down by the
Western side, reaches as far as Point Riche. But the
Island Cape Briton, as also all others both in y^e mouth
of the River St. Laurens, and the Gulph of the
same name, are given by the same Treaty to the
French, with all manner of Liberty, to Fortify any
Place, or Places, there.*
