The average disbursements, occasioned by attending during one Parliament, for members residing at a distance, is from  $\pounds 100$  to  $\pounds 200$ . It will be observed, that of the fifty members thirtythree are natives of, or reside in the districts of Quebec and Three Rivers, and Gaspé, containing only about a third of the population. Frequent attempts have been made, on the part of the Adminis-tration, to excite in the House local jealousies; but they have always failed both with the members and the Country.
