Figures on the land express the height in feet above high water ordinary springs

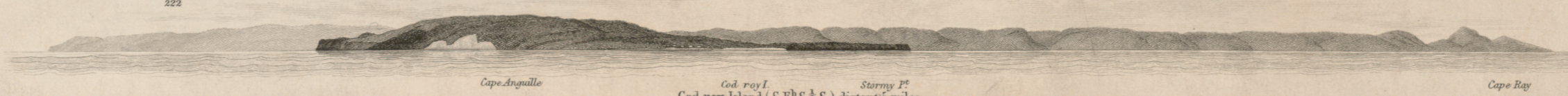
col. coral, g. gravel, m. mud, r. rock, s. sand, sh. shells, st. stones
