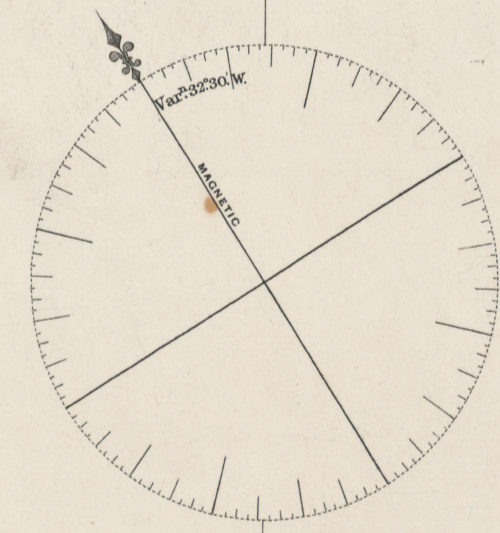
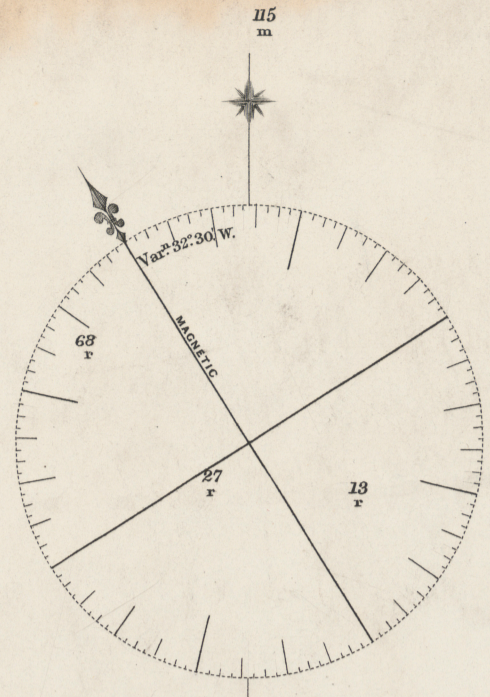




Leading Mark for entering Sailors Harbour
