H.W. F. & C. Xⁿ Spring Tides rise 6 feet Neaps 4 ft
Their diurnal inequality at times causes a difference of 2 hours
in the two tides of the same day and of two feet in their height.

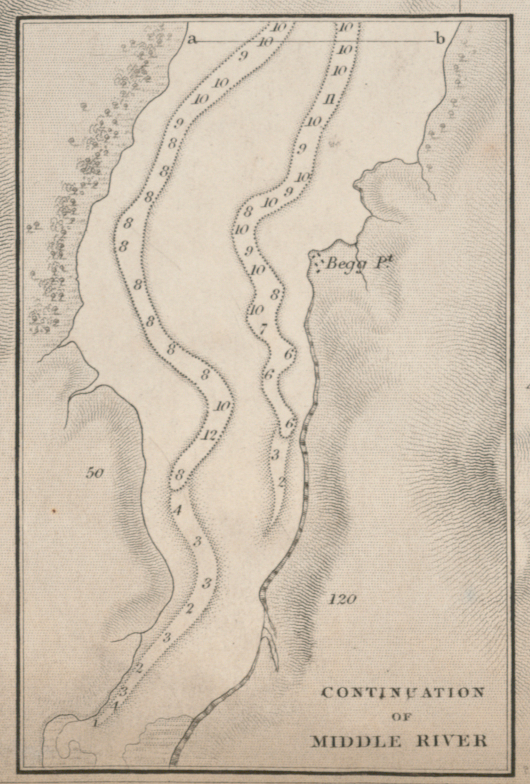
Variation $22^{\circ} 50'$ W in 1867 increasing about $2'$ annually.
