

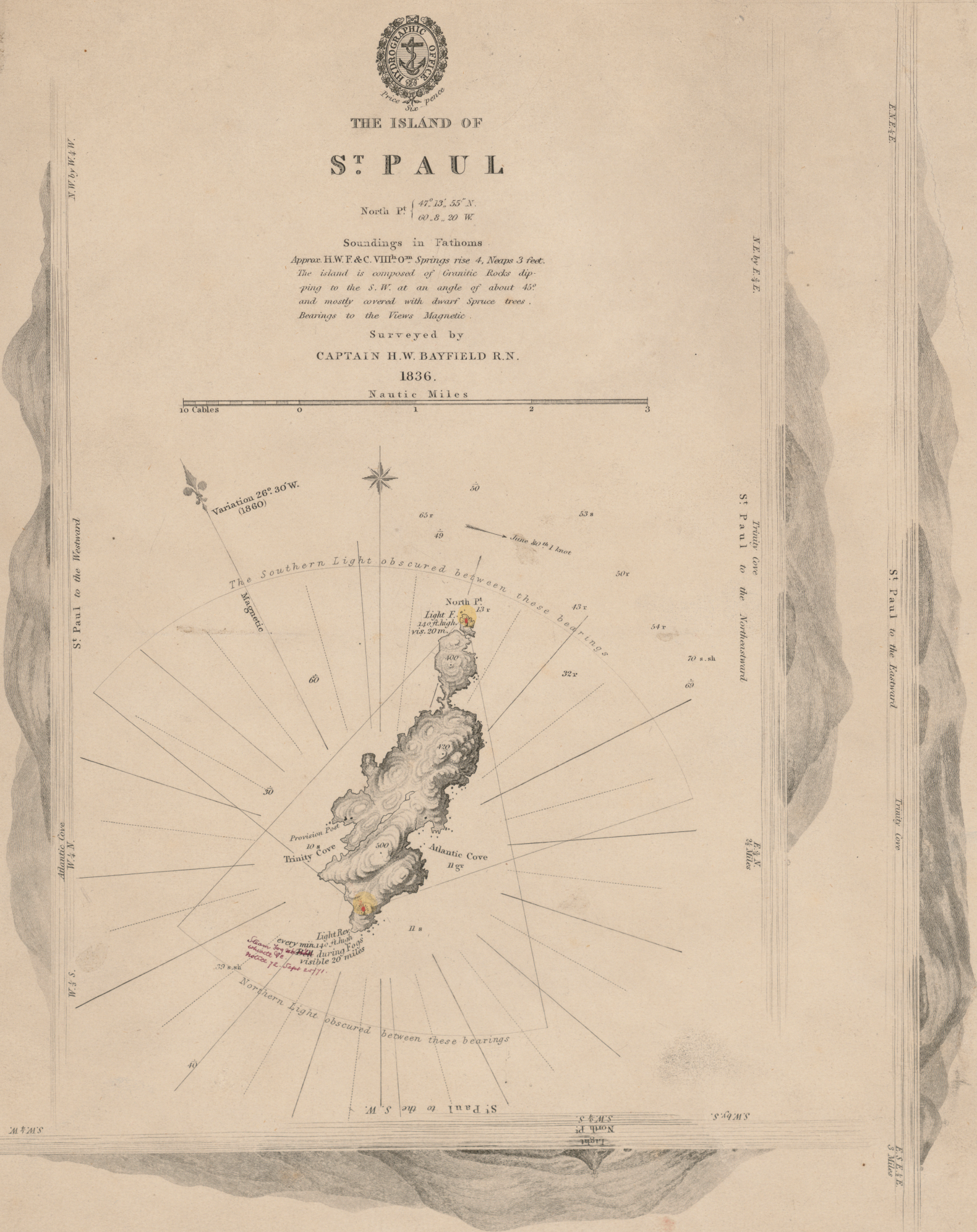
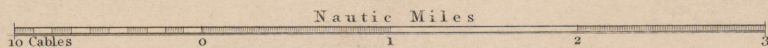


# THE ISLAND OF ST. PAUL

Soundings in Fathoms  
Approx. H.W.F. & C. VIII<sup>th</sup> O<sup>th</sup> Springs rise 4, Neaps 3 feet.  
The island is composed of Granitic Rocks dipping to the S.W. at an angle of about 45° and mostly covered with dwarf Spruce trees.
