The knots on the arrows show the strength of the Stream at spring tides.

The soundings are given from low water at spring tides.

Under the soundings a diamond and in small circles, a star, or shell, or flag, or anchor, or other mark, signifies the nature of the bottom.

T. stands for Tides, B. for Bore, and E. for Ebb.

B.C.N. is the Bore, Black, Chequered, and White.

The Bearings to the Mark are Magnetic.

Variation in 1871, increasing annually about 4' westerly.
