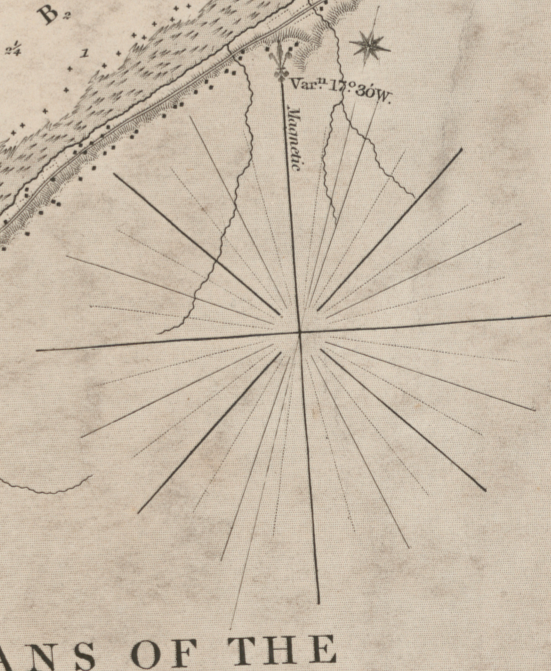
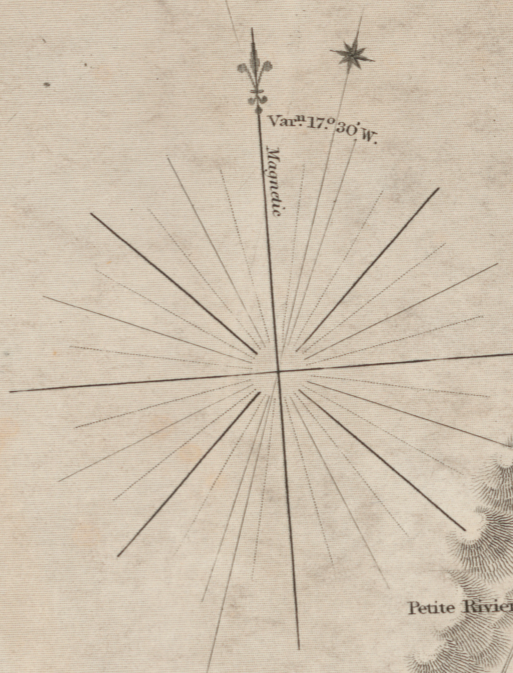


Magnetic North
