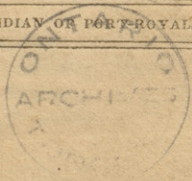

EQUATION OF TIME.

Shews how many Minutes Clocks and Watches ought to go faster or slower than a true Sun Dial, or time of Sun's Rising and Setting. To rectify the Clock or Watch, set it so much faster or slower as appears in the Calendar.

EXAMPLE.—On 4th January set it 5' 12' faster than the Sun, and if it differs afterwards any day, so many Minutes as set forth for that day, it goes true.

JAMAICA.

This island, the name of which is said to have signified, in the language of the original inhabitants, "*abounding in springs*," was discovered by Christopher Columbus, in his second expedition to the New World, on the 3d of May, 1494, and, after a slight resistance, he next day took possession of it. After the unsuccessful attack on St. Domingo, in 1655 (during the usurpation of Cromwell), the fleet under Admiral Penn, Vice-Admiral Goodson, and Rear-Admiral Blagge, and the land forces under General Venables, arrived at Port-Caguaya (Port-Royal), on the 9th of May. Next evening the troops landed at Passage-Fort, which was fortified by nine pieces of cannon, and had a garrison of 500 men. Little resistance having been made, about a week after a capitulation was ratified on the part of the English by Major-Gen. Fortescue, Vice-Admiral Goodson, and Colonels Holdip and D'Oyley. It is situate about 4000 miles south-west of England, 90 to the west of St. Domingo, about the same distance to the south of Cuba, and 435 to the north of Carthagena, on the great continent of South-America. The centre of Jamaica lies in $18^{\circ} 12' N.$ Lat. and in $76^{\circ} 45' W.$ Long. from London, is about 150 miles in length, and, on a medium of three measurements, at different parts; about 40 miles in breadth, and is supposed to contain, owing to its numerous and high mountains, 4,080,000 acres. It is divided into three counties—MIDDLESEX, SURREY, and CORNWALL.

MIDDLESEX contains eight parishes—St. Catherine, St. John, St. Dorothy, St. Thomas in the Vale, Clarendon, Vere, St. Mary, and St. Ann.

SURREY contains seven parishes—Kingston, Port-Royal, St. Andrew, St. David, St. Thomas in the East, Portland, and St. George.

CORNWALL contains five parishes—St. Elizabeth, Westmorland, Hanover, St. James, and Trelawny.

CHRONOLOGY.

- 1509 First settlement by the Spaniards, under Don Juan de Esquivello, Lieut. to Diego Columbus. Esquivel (Old-Harbour), was named after him.
- 1523 St. Jago de la Vega founded by Diego Columbus, and in 1555 had the honour of giving the title of Marquis to his heir.
- 1535 Thirty sugar-mills established in the island.
- 1655 Don Christopher Arnaldo Sasi, Governor.
- Venables, on his return to England, severely reprimanded by the Council, sent prisoner to the Tower, and dismissed from all his employments. Penn was also committed to the same place. They were liberated by the Protector on making submissions.

- 1655 Major-General Sedgewicke sent by Cromwell to command the army.
- 1656 June 24, Sedgewicke dies, and the command devolves on Colonel D'Oyley, who executes Major Throgmorton for mutiny. December 14, General Brayne arrives with several transports, and assumes the command.
- 1657 Brayne dies on the 2d of September, and the command again devolves on D'Oyley. Don Christopher Arnaldo Sasi lands at the Northside, with all the former inhabitants, amounting to about 500 men, and a reinforcement of 1000 men from Old Spain, and built a fort of some strength on a rocky eminence near the sea at Rio-Nuevo, in St. Mary.
- 1658 On the 24th of June, D'Oyley, with 500 picked men, attacked the fort, and completely routed the enemy. They had 300 privates, several captains, two priests, and one sergeant-major killed; 100 privates, and six captains made prisoners; many wounded; and lost the royal standard and ten colours. The stragglers soon after quitted the island.
- 1660 Military Government ceased, and Governor D'Oyley, with a Council of twelve men, elected by the inhabitants, regulates the Civil Government.
- 1662 Lord Windsor fitted out an expedition of 1000 men against St. Jago de Cuba, who took the fort, demolished the fortifications and the town, consisting of 2000 dwelling-houses, which they razed to the ground. The loss sustained by the enemy was probably not short of half a million sterling.
- 1663 First General Assembly summoned by Sir Charles Littleton.
- 1664 Met 20th January, and exercised the right of adjourning themselves.
- 1689 Storm.
- 1690 The first insurrection of importance, which happened in Clarendon.
- 1692 June 7, great earthquake, which destroyed Port-Royal.
- 1694 In June a descent was made by M. Du Casse, with three ships of war, 23 transports, and 1500 men; but who, by the gallant behaviour of the Militia, were obliged to return to Hispaniola, after having lost 700 men.
- 1712 28th August, storm. 1722, 28th August, great storm.
- 1726 22d October, storm.
- 1728 Permanent Revenue Act settled.
- 1739 Peace concluded with the Maroons.
- 1744 October 20, great storm. 1751, September 2, storm.
- 1759 October, an act passed dividing the island into three counties.
- 1760 Insurrection of the Coromantees in St. Mary, which their countrymen throughout the island were privy to.
- 1763 September 14, the magazine at Fort-Augusta, containing about 2000 barrels of gunpowder, blown up by lightning; by which accident 91 persons were killed and wounded, and the damage estimated at 43,000*l.* sterling.

- 1765 Another insurrection attempted in St. Mary's, but disconcerted by the hurry of the ringleaders.
- 1780 October 3, hurricane.
- 1781 August 1, great storm.
- 1782 April 12, Rear-Admiral Sir George Brydges Rodney, off Dominica, obtained a complete victory over the French fleet, commanded by the Count de Grasse, said to be destined against this island. The Count was taken in the Ville de Paris, four other ships of the line were captured, and one sunk.
- 1784 July 30, hurricane. 1785, August 27, hurricane.
- 1786 October 20, storm.
- 1792 May 24, Lord Rodney died. He was born in December, 1718.
- 1795 Rebellion of the Trelawny Maroons. August 1, Martial Law proclaimed.
- August 12, Lieut. Col. Sandford, Quartermaster M'Bride, and six privates of the 20th, and eight privates of the 18th Light Dragoons, Col. Jarvis Gallimore, and a number of respectable Gentlemen of the Militia, killed in a defile near the Maroon-Town.
- September 12, Col. Fitch, one corporal, and seven privates, of the 83d Regiment, Capt. Brissett of Fort-Charlotte, and Captains Reid and Badnedge of the Accompong-Maroons, killed by the Maroons in the cockpits near Cudjoe-Town. Captains Lee and Jacob Brunt, one corporal, and six privates of the 83d Regiment, Mr. M'Farlane, superintendent of negroes, and three Accompong-Maroons, were wounded.
- 1796 January 12, the first party of Maroons surrendered, consisting of upwards of 40.
- March 18, the Maroons having all surrendered, Martial Law ceased.
- April 27, the Maroons, consisting of upwards of 500 men, women, and children, transported to Halifax. The Assembly resolved that they should be provided with clothing and provisions for three years, and to have lands purchased for them, at the expence of this island.
- June 1, Stamp Act commenced.
- 1799 December 22, Martial Law proclaimed.
- December 23, Joseph Sas Portas, a spy, hanged on the Parade of Kingston.
- 1802 The Royal Assent having been given to the Act for constituting Kingston a Corporation, under the name of *The Mayor, Aldermen and Commonalty of the City and Parish of Kingston*, the election of Officers took place Nov. 15:
- Mayor*, Hon. John Jaques.
- Aldermen*, George Kinghorn, Wm. Savage, Stewart Bruce, Robert Rainford, John Hinde, John Gutzmer, John Bull (senior), James Stewart, James Amoss, Wm. Ross, Benjamin Waterhouse, and Alex. Thompson, Esqrs.

Common Council-Men, Joseph Barnes, Stephen Minot, John Burrows, John Garnett, Richard Chamberlaine, Thomas Stevenson, Wm. Mitchelson, James Muir, Robt. Hamilton, Wm. Parke, George Kinkead, and John Campbell, Esqrs.

The following is a description of the City Seal: On one side, the Arms, Crest, Supporters, and Mottoes—Legend, *Sigillum Commune Civitatis de Kingston in Jamaica*. Reverse, Britannia, in the dress of Minerva, holding the trident in one hand, and in the other a mirror, reflecting the rays of the benign influence of Heaven on the produce of the island; behind her the British Lion, supporting her shield, a conch-shell at her feet, and at a distance a ship under sail—Legend, *Hos fovet, hos curat, servatque Britannia Mater*, "Britannia, the mother-country, cherishes and protects these fruits."

- 1805 April 1, Martial Law proclaimed.—Taken off on the evening of the 19th. The French squadron, five sail of the line, two brigs, and two schooners, under Admiral Missiessi, and the land forces under Gen. Le Grange, attacked Dominica, but bravery was obliged to yield to superiority of numbers, and the French, after levying 10,000*l*. ster. sailed for Europe.
- May 24, Martial Law proclaimed, the combined French and Spanish fleet, consisting of 17 sail of the line, one 50, six frigates, and four smaller vessels, under Admirals Gravina, Villeneuve, and Dumanoir, having arrived at Martinique. June 3, Lord Nelson arrived at Barbados, with ten sail of the line, and three frigates; on hearing of his Lordship's arrival, the enemy proceeded for Europe.—June 22, Martial Law taken off.
- 1806 Feb. 6, Vice-Adm. Duckworth, with six sail of the line, one 64, two frigates, and two sloops, engaged, off Santo-Domingo, the squadron of Rear-Admiral Lesseigues, five sail of the line, two frigates, and a corvette. *L'Alexandre*, of 84 guns, *Le Jupiter* and *Le Brave*, of 74 each, were taken; *L'Imperial*, of 120, and *Le Diomedé*, of 74, run on shore by the enemy; the frigates and corvette escaped.
- 1807 Jan. 1, Curragoa taken, in a most gallant manner, by the *Arethusa*, *Anson*, *Fisgard*, and *Latona* frigates, Captains Ch. Brisbane, Wm. Lydiard, Wm. Bolton, and Jas. Athol Wood.
- 1808 May 27, Recruits of the 2d West-India Regiment mutiny on parade: Lieut. and Adjutant Ellis was killed, and Major Darley died of the wounds he received. Nine of the mutineers were killed; one died of wounds; 16 were found guilty, seven of whom were shot.
- 1809 A conspiracy discovered amongst the negroes of Kingston, by the confession of George Burgess, a private in the 2d West-India Regiment, whilst under sentence of death for desertion. Two of the conspirators were tried, found guilty, and executed, on the 1st of April.
