

The Winter Club

THE WINTER CLUB SEASON is from October to May. The Club is closed during the summer months.

A complete Dining-Room is in operation and Luncheon and Dinner are served every day, except Sunday, as well as the usual Afternoon Tea.

The Club provides complete facilities for Skating and Badminton and has the additional advantage of being a firstclass social club.

On the following pages will be found brief references to the activities of the Club, information as to the Club hours, House Rules, etc., for the guidance of the members and their guests. All rules and regulations are subject to change at the discretion of the Committee of Management.

The Committee trust that all members will co-operate to ensure continuance of the Club's successful operation and their own pleasure and enjoyment.

Clubhouse Hours

The Clubhouse is open daily, except Sunday, during the season, from 10 a.m. to 12 p.m. The Rink from 10 a.m. to 11 p.m.; the Badminton Courts from 10 a.m. to 11 p.m. The hours for Intermediates and Juniors are posted on the Notice Boards.

Music

The Orchestra will play in the Tea Room on Monday evenings from .8 p.m. to 10.30 p.m., and on Wednesday and Saturday afternoons from 4.15 p.m. to 6.30 p.m.

Privileged Members

Members of the Toronto Skating Club, the Minto Skating Club of Ottawa, the Quebec Winter Club, the Winnipeg Winter Club and the Calgary Skating Club, may register as visitors for a period of two weeks, without fee, and if residing in Montreal for the whole season, are extended the facilities of the Club, on payment of the annual dues (but without entrance fee), for that season only.

Senior members may introduce, as privileged members, those residing more than 50 miles from Montreal, for a period not exceeding two weeks. A fee of \$1.00 per day will be charged.

Visitors to Montreal for the season only, when properly introduced, may be accorded privileged membership for one season only, at the discretion of the Committee, on payment of the annual dues of \$50.00, but without entrance fee.

Cards must be obtained from the Secretary.

Guests

Guests, whether out-of-town or residents of Montreal, when accompanied by members, may be introduced any day during club hours, but on Wednesday and Saturday afternoons no member may introduce more than two residents of Montreal at the tea hour, unless they are being entertained at luncheon or for dinner.

Children may not be introduced as guests in the Tea Rooms on Wednesday or Saturday afternoons.

Guests, resident of Montreal, when accompanied by members, may be extended Skating and Badminton privileges at any time on payment of \$1.00 per day fee, but the same guest may not enjoy these privileges more than five times in any one season.

Members must register all guests and state in the Guest Book if Skating or Badminton privileges are desired.

Juniors are not permitted to introduce or entertain guests.

Dining-Rooms

Luncheon will be served from 12.30 p.m. to 2 p.m., and Dinner from 7 p.m. to 8 p.m.

Reservations for special Luncheons and Dinners may be made on application to the Steward.

Members will confer a favour and ensure prompt service for themselves by notifying the Steward in advance of any special entertainments or added service they require in the Dining-Rooms.

Members intending to dine at the Club are requested to notify the Steward one hour in advance.

Children, when accompanied by Seniors, will be admitted to the Dining-Rooms for Luncheon, but not for Dinner.

Private Entertainments

Members may engage the Dining-Room floor of the Clubhouse a limited number of evenings for private entertaining, such as bridge parties, dances or supper parties, for a moderate fee, and on such occasions that floor of the Club will be closed to other members. A notice to this effect will be posted on the Notice Boards for one week.

Teas and Receptions and Children's parties, in the afternoons, may be arranged for if they do not interfere with the ordinary privileges of the other members.

Badminton and Skating parties may be held by arrangement with the Chairman of the Badminton or Skating Committee and with the Steward, if the date does not conflict with Club fixtures, and sufficient notice can be given to members. Not more than three courts may be exclusively reserved for one party.

Dinner Dances

Unless notice to the contrary is posted on the Notice Board, Dinner Dances are held on alternate Saturday evenings. To avoid overcrowding the covers are limited and members should make their reservations as far in advance as possible. All reservations will be charged to members unless cancelled 24 hours in advance of the date of the Dance. For parties of ten or more the notice of cancellation must be received at least four days in advance.

Club Night

Every Monday evening during the season has been set aside as "Club Night," and a special dinner will be served to skaters and badminton players and their guests. The orchestra will be in attendance after dinner for skating. Members should notify the Steward as early as possible of their intention to dine at the Club.

PROFESSIONALS

Skating

The services of MISS CHARLOTT have been re-engaged, and members are invited to make use of her expert services, whenever possible, to improve the skating standard of the Club. The fees are \$2.00 for lesson of one half hour, and 50c. for each orchestra number.

Badminton

H. CATER has been engaged as Professional to give instruction, supply equipment and do repair work. The fee for lesson of one half hour is 50c.

Lessons booked for Skating or Badminton, unless cancelled the day previous, or a substitute provided, will be charged to the member making the reservation.

Badminton Section

Seven Badminton Courts are available for play from 10 a.m. until 11 p.m. daily, except Sunday, during the Club season.

Rackets may be rented from the Hall Porter.

Ladies are requested to wear white or light colours on the Badminton Courts; men, white flannels.

Hours for Intermediates and Juniors are posted on the Notice Board.

Intermediates and Juniors are not eligible for entry in senior events.

Skating Section

The Rink will be open daily, except Sunday, from 10 a.m. to 11 p.m., with the exception of periods required to re-surface the ice. The skating hours for Juniors and Intermediates will be posted on the Notice Board.

On Wednesday and Saturday afternoons, when the band is in attendance, Juniors and Intermediates must leave the ice promptly at the hour posted. Those learning to waltz are given extended time for waltzing only.

Juniors and Intermediates who have passed their Third Class Test have Senior skating privileges during the day, but not in the evenings.

Tube or straight skates are not permitted in the Rink.

No games that interfere with other skaters will be permitted, except on Wednesday and Saturday mornings, which will be regarded as Children's days, but hockey or other games that would damage the Club's property or building are barred.

Motor Cars

Members are particularly requested not to park their cars in front of the Club so that they block the entrance. Some members have disregarded this request, or permitted their chauffeurs to do so, causing much inconvenience.

A Parking Garage on the opposite side of Drummond Street is available to members. Cars parked there will be delivered to the Club on a telephone request and payment of a small fee.

Cards

No card games are permitted in the Tea Room overlooking the Rink.

Cards may be played in the upstairs Tea Room, but members are requested not to have their tables set up at the windows and so obstruct the view of others who desire to watch the Badminton.

Tipping

Members must not offer any tip or gratuity to any servant of the Club.

A special notice will be sent to all members when the Staff Gratuity Fund is open, and donations may then be sent to the Secretary. The total donated is distributed on an equitable basis to all the Staff, according to the services rendered.

Locker Keys

Intermediate and Junior Members who waste the time of the Club attendants by forgetting their keys will be charged a fee of 10c. each time their locker is opened for them.

Smoking

Intermediates and Juniors are not permitted to smoke on the Club premises.

Personal Effects

The Committee take all reasonable precautions to safeguard members' effects left in lockers or in other parts of the Clubhouse, but the Club cannot assume responsibility for these effects. They are at the owners' risk at all times.

Members are particularly requested to keep their lockers locked.

House Rules

On entering the Club all members must register in the Members' Register at the Hall Porter's Desk.

On Wednesday and Saturday afternoons the mezzanine gallery is reserved for Badminton players, and Tea cannot be served there to other than players.

Skaters must wear guards on their skates when in the Lounges or Dining-Rooms.

Junior members are not allowed in the Dining-Rooms or Lounges unless accompanied by Senior members.

Intermediates and Juniors are not allowed in the Tea Rooms on Wednesday and Saturday afternoons.

Junior members must leave the Clubhouse after the close of their Skating or Badminton hours, but in no case may they remain in the Club later than 5.30 p.m.

Intermediate members must leave the Clubhouse by 6 p.m.

Junior members are reminded that unnecessary noise, rowdy behaviour, or incivility to the Club attendants, is not permitted and any infraction of this rule renders them liable to suspension.
