## STARTING OR SETTING-UP WORK

With left hand hold Set-up as shown in cut with

Set-up 1/8 of an inch below the top of Needle-Cylinder.

No more, no less, and evenly all around the needle cylinder.

Commence Setting-up at A or back of machine, and

Set-up from right to left by

Placing the yarn around each needle and around

Any corresponding hook of Set-up. Twice-when-necessary.

Cross the yarn from right to left between each and every needle as shown in cut.

## HOW TO SEAM OR CLOSE THE TOE

Rip out last row knit. Close or seam toe with ravelled yarn. Each-stitch has the needle passed-through-it-twice thus: put the needle in through the first-stitch and out through the next-one on the same side; then put the needle in through the first-stitch and out through the needle in through the stitch you brought the needle in through the stitch you brought the needle out of on the first side, and out through the next-stitch on the same side, and so on.



**NEW HEELS AND TOES.** A new toe can be knit in old work by cutting off the Toe and casting half the foot-stitches on as many needles, and new-heel by cutting out the heel and casting the upper-stitches-heel on as many needles; then knit heel or toe in the usual manner.

Seam the new heel to foot with closing stitch. (See above cut.)





# How to Finish Full Fashioned, Plain or Flat Web Hosiery



The cut represents two pieces of flat-web with three-stitches-in-The-upper-half each. The-upper-half is turned over to show the right-side of the knitting as it appears when sewn - together. When properly done it will appear as if knit without-a-Seam. The sewing should always be done from the inside be done from the inside, or wrong side of web. The -middle -stitch -of each-web, as shown in each-half of cut, is ravelled - out that the stitches to be taken up stitches to be taken up may be more readily seen. There are three-loops which appear on the selvage; only one of them is-the-sight-one, viz., the middle or smallest o.e. The needle passes through the one on the left-edge, and each time the needle is drawn through two stitches are taken two stitches are taken up, one from each web.




