● These twelve questions are a test of the knowledge, intelligence and patriotic interest of every Canadian in our country's war effort. Make an estimate or a guess, and place an X in the square opposite each answer you think is correct. Then check against the list printed upside down in the panel below. A score of 6 correct is average; a score of 9 is very good; a score of 11 puts you at the head of the class. Anyone who can score 12 correct without peeking should celebrate by buying an extra Victory Bond.

1. What was the pre-war strength of Canada's permanent army forces?

2. What is the present strength of all Canadian army units, at home and abroad?

- Under 350,000

3. The personnel of Canada's navy has multiplied many times since the war began. Which is the correct increase?

4. What is the present strength of the Royal Canadian Air Force at home and on all fronts?

12. In the last Victory Loan nearly two and a half million individuals bought one or more Victory Bonds. It is estimated, however, that there are more than five million Canadians who are earning enough to buy a bond in the next campaign. If five million patriotic Canadians stood shoulder to shoulder, how far would this solid fighting line stretch across the country?
